MISSION: 2008-2022

India@75 was taken up by CII as the flagship initiative towards its nation building agenda to encourage and facilitate collaboration between industry and different stakeholder groups on issues aligned to national priorities.

In 2012, the India@75 Foundation was established with an eminent Board of Trustees.

India@75 Foundation had a laid-out vision aptly titled "The People's Agenda". With support from CII's institutional outreach and strength worked towards creating an inclusively developed India by 2022. The approach recognized each state, group, and community as having a unique set of issues and solutions.

ADVOCACY



India@75 was well received by the Union and State Governments, corporates, and civil society. The first major advocacy exercise involved seeding elements of the vision document into the manifestos of political parties during State-level elections and the General elections in 2014.

To mainstream the India@75 vision, CII met with influential leaders, including those from politics and business. Mr Narendra Modi, Honourable Prime Minister of India, who was then the Chief Minister of Gujarat, was among the first to understand and appreciate the

potential of the vision document. He committed to mainstreaming the agenda nationally and • walked his talk when he became the Honourable Prime Minister of India. Under his leadership, many of the India@75 vision elements found their way into the development discourse. Skill India, Digital India, Smart Cities Mission, Start-up India and Ayushman Bharat Yojana are all cases in point.

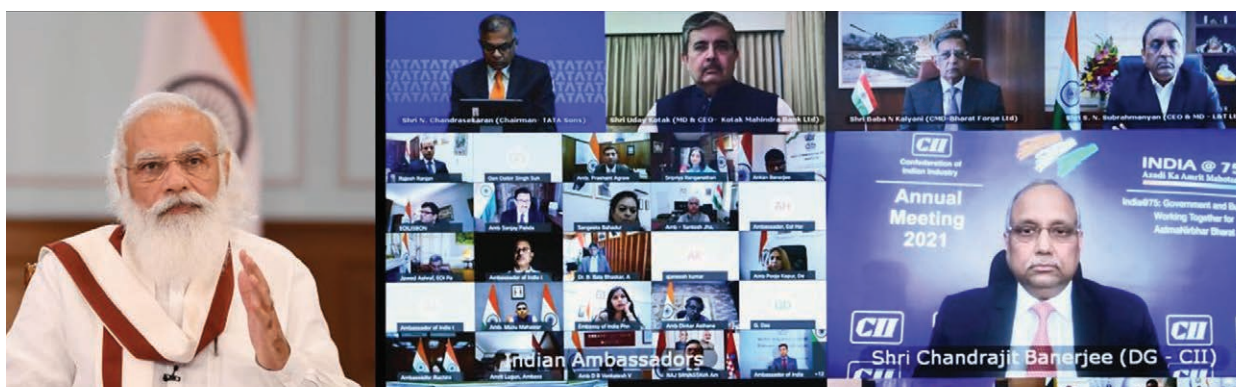

REALISING THE INDIA@75 VISION

Since the India@75 vision was articulated, India made considerable progress in the areas highlighted in The People's Agenda. CII contributed to these priorities by aligning itself with the India@75 framework and architecture.

In its capacity as a premier industry body, CII worked both directly and through its members, as well as the India@75 Foundation. Glimpses of its work mapped under the India@75 framework are:



India@75 Call to Action



Agriculture and Healthcare

- **Rural Business Hubs (RBH):** This is a pilot project being run by CII FACE in collaboration with USAID. These hubs are one-stop shops for private and public sector services designed to help local farmers increase their income.
- **Surakshit Khadya Abhiyan:** CII ran this campaign jointly with the National Association of Street Vendors of India and VOICE to enhance consumer awareness on practices related to food and establish food safety benchmarks through initiatives such as the Food Safety Award Programs. It also helped both street food vendors and caterers adopt and adhere to hygienic practices.



Business and Economy

- **Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs):** CII supported MSMEs to become a global force and the key driver of India's growth. More than 3,000 SMEs across India were helped to save more than INR 1,000 crore through the adoption of various best practices.
- **Making Indian Industry Globally Competitive:** CII set up nine Centres of Excellence to help Indian businesses become a global force. These Centres of Excellence help build the capacity of industry along parameters such as technology, quality, and sustainability.



Entrepreneurship, Education and Skills Development

- **The National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC):** CII was identified as the lead partner by the Government for setting up NSDC as a Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) as part of the Public-Private Partnership (PPP) model.
- **Model Career Centres (MCC):** These new-age employment centres counsel, skill, and employ youth through job fairs. CII is operating 39 MCCs in a hub-and-spoke model with support from the government and industry across the country.
- **Revamping of 1,396 ITIs:** CII partnered with corporates to make the infrastructure, curriculum, and pedagogy of the existing 398 Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) more market-relevant and competitive. This exercise helped make ITIs the preferred skilling destination for 80,000 youth.
- **Job-Oriented Skills Training:** CII conducted employment-led skills training under a number of CSR initiatives.
- **Skillpedia:** This web portal was conceptualized, designed, and developed by India@75 to complement the Government of India's goal of creating a 500 million skilled workforce by 2022. The portal has since been taken over and managed by the Skills Ministry.



Urbanization and Environment Sustainability

- **Green Buildings:** At 7 billion sq. ft., India has the second-largest green building footprint in the world. Approximately 90 percent of this has been catalyzed by CII's Indian Green Business Council.
- **Indian Business and Biodiversity Initiative (IBBI):** CII is helping the government run this platform to sensitize, guide, and mentor Indian businesses in biodiversity conservation across their value chain and beyond.
- **City Connect Platform:** City Connect Platforms are industry-led, citizen-centric platforms that facilitate convergence among various stakeholders and act as an interface between local citizens and the administration for collaborative urbanization. The initiative focuses on developing affordable solutions to local issues in sync with the national agenda.
- **Project Roshni:** In 2011, India@75 and Roshni Prachodaya Society, Rashtrapati Bhavan, signed an MoU. The intent was to document the process of creating sustainable urban habitats through capacity building of communities. The project also worked to sensitize students on issues related to the environment and sustainability.



Technology and Innovation

- Global Innovation & Technology Alliance (GITA):** CII set up GITA to increase private investment in research and development (R&D) and build a skilled workforce capable of designing and implementing research projects. The initiative also aims to strengthen India's reputation as an innovator and provider of technologies at the global level.
- Prime Minister's Fellowship Scheme for Doctoral Research:** CII helped institutionalize this scheme to address the brain drain from India's research ecosystem. Jointly funded by industry and the government, the programme offers a lucrative stipend to fellows and provides them with a vibrant research environment. Participants work under the guidance of both an academic and an industry mentor.

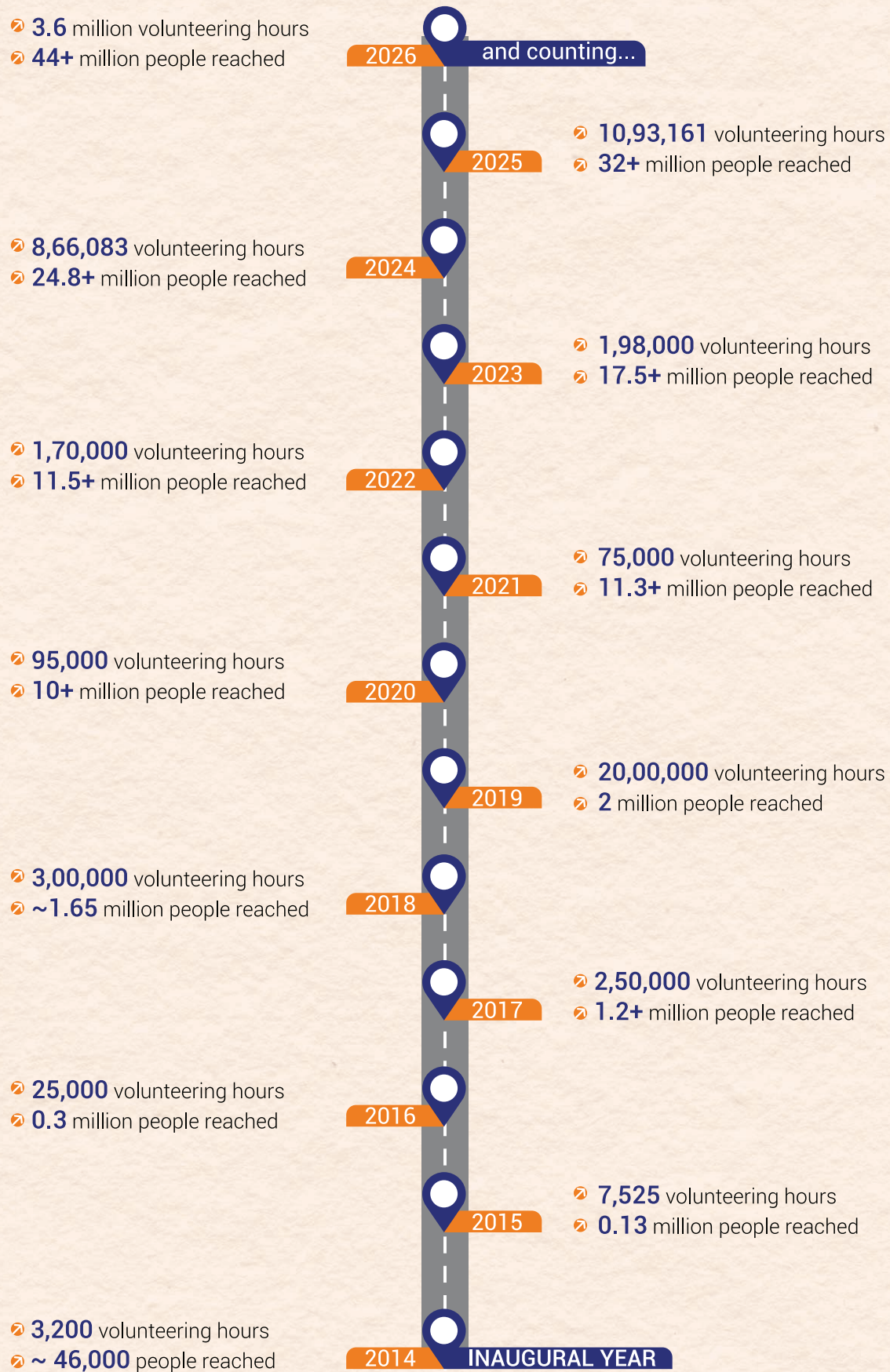
Volunteering

- **National Volunteering Grid (NVG):** This volunteering portal helps build a structured ecosystem for volunteering by connecting NGOs with professionals, corporates, and individuals who want to offer their time and skills to a good cause.
- **Count Me In:** This is the Foundation's generic volunteering programme that engages volunteers from all walks of life to contribute to high-impact social development activities.
- **Pro Bono:** India@75 works with corporates and professionals, connecting them to NGOs that require capacity-building support.
- **Employee Volunteering Programs (EVPs) in Corporates:** The Foundation helped corporates provide credible volunteering opportunities to professionals within their local geography.
- **National Volunteering Week:** Was institutionalized as an annual event from 18 to 24 January every year since 2014. Over last 13 years volunteers were mobilized impacting 44 million beneficiaries directly / indirectly. Volunteer activities primarily focused on awareness about health, education, community development, environment, water, energy etc
- **Economic Value Aggregator (EVA) Tool:** This tool helped monetize and measure pro bono services and encouraged businesses to institutionalize volunteering.

Functional Literacy Programme (FLiP)

A capacity building programme allowed different stakeholders to help workers from the EWS and unorganized sector in enhancing their understanding of digitalization for economic and social empowerment. The industry adopted FLiP both as a CSR initiative (under SDG 4) or, as an HR initiative for its workers in factories and offices. NGOs took it further for the migrant labourers for their capacity building and enhancement of

disposable incomes. Building on this, the Foundation launched FLiP-on-Wheels - an innovative mobile digital hub designed to bring digital and financial literacy directly to rural communities. Successful pilot programmes have been conducted across Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, and Jharkhand, positively impacting more than 5,500 individuals, including women, young girls, farmers, and youth.



Lighthouse Project: Mission 75@75

The Lighthouse Project, a government-industry collaboration aimed at mainstreaming urban youth through counselling and vocational training. Capital expenditure is borne by the Government, while operational expenditure is supported by corporates.

The Pune Lighthouse model was recognized by the Hon'ble Prime Minister as an exemplary initiative. 33 Lighthouses operational, with 20 more expected to become functional by end 2026. The goal was to establish 75 Lighthouses by August 2022.

Pan India Car Rally under the Ambit of MHA

CII supported the National Security Guard (NSG) in organizing a 7,500-kilometre rally across 13 states and 22 cities over 29 days (2–30 October). The rally visited places of historical significance while promoting the

message of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav. It was flagged off by the Hon'ble Home Minister from Red Fort and welcomed by several ministers across the route.



Our Country, Our Vision: India@75 Summit

Since 2020, CII has organized the India@75 Summit to advance a shared national development vision. The Summit also

assessed progress on the India@75 vision and gathered inputs for the post-2022 development agenda.



Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav and the vision for India@100

15 August 2022 marked an important milestone in India's history, completing 75 years as a free and vibrant democracy. While the nation has made significant progress, there remains immense potential for future growth and development.

This milestone provided an opportunity to create a collective vision for Future India through a participatory planning process. Multi-stakeholder engagement was considered essential because a vision with broad acceptance is more likely to be successfully implemented.

The Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) believes that India Inc. can play a critical role in catalyzing this visioning process. With its extensive reach and resources, CII can bring together diverse stakeholder groups to identify common goals and collaborative solutions.

Accordingly, CII's regional, state, and zonal offices convened special visioning sessions involving government officials, industry leaders, and civil society representatives under the umbrella of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav.

Objectives of the Visioning Sessions

- » Develop a common vision for each state by 2047 based on local priorities.
- » Identify gaps on the path to achieving this vision and explore sustainable solutions.
- » Define the roles different stakeholder groups can play in realizing the vision.
- » Explore how individual states can contribute to the broader vision of India@100.
- » Consolidate learnings into a White Paper on India@100 for submission to the Government.
- » States including Gujarat, Bihar, Jharkhand, Delhi, Maharashtra, Karnataka, Punjab, Jammu & Kashmir, Andhra Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Madhya Pradesh, and Uttar Pradesh had already conducted these exercises, while others were in the process of organizing their sessions.
